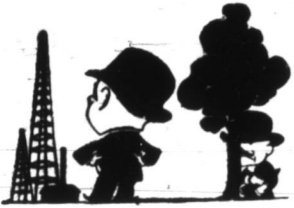


In which we double-cross a master mind
