Extension Service to Divert Every Effort to Save the Forests of North Carolina

RALEIGH. Jan: 4 .- According to ap announcement from Director B. W. Kligore of the North Carolina Exten sion service, H. M. Curren, a graduate of the Staty college and a native born North Carolinian, has been ap pointed exténsion specialist in farm forestry to help Tar Heel fa mers i handling the farm woodlets and oth erwise developing the farm forestr industry of this state.

Mr. Curren has been well trained He has been in the employ of the United States Forest service for year and during that time has made studie of forestry problems all over the en tire country. He has also seen sever years service in the Phillipine Island and about five years service in the tropical forests of South America. Re cently he had charge of a lecture course of tropical forests at Yale un versity

He comes to North Carolina after these years of service and study t render assistance in any of the for estry problems that may be acute wit the farmers of North Carolina at thi time. It will be remembered that thi work was formerly done by Harry I Krausz who left the extension service shortly after the war
