CORRESPONDENCE COURSES.

A study just made of the records of the bureau of correspondence instruction of the University shows that this bureau is giving formal instruction by mail in all but twenty one countries in the state.

Modern development in educational work now make it possible for those who cannot go to college to receive some instruction and training by means of the correspondence method.

This bureau of the University has one young man taking courses by mail, who, because he is crippled, has been confined in his bed for years. He is studying English composition and business English and writes that these courses are helping him in advertising business which he has started.

There are now 288 students taking correspondence instruction in various subjects.
