QUESTION—HOW MANY FEET WILL THE WALKING WALK-OVER MAN WALK IN 7 DAYS, AT 15 HOURS A DAY?

ANSWER—The walking man makes one revolution in 45 seconds. The diameter of the circle is 30 inches. He walks in all 7x15 hours or 105 hours or 6,300 minutes or 378,000 seconds. 378,000 seconds divided by 45 is 8,400 revolutions. The circumference of a circle equals 3.1416 x the diameter. 30 inches x 3.1416 is 94.248, which is the number of inches covered in one revolution. 94.248 x 8,400 equals 791,633.2 inches space covered by the little man. This total divided by 12 equals 65,973.6 feet.
