THE TREASURY WILL NEED NO MORE SILVER AFTER JULY

WASHINGTON, Mar. 31 tion that the treasury requ of silver bullion purchased under th Pittman act will be fulfilled by July 1st, was made tonight by Directs Scobey, of the mint. He said that about 20,000,000 fine ounces remai to be bought under the act and es

timated that with silver product of hases during the next three months will make up the amount needed.

The purchases will stop abruptly when the requirements have been me nd for that reason the director said every effort will be made to assure ie American miners that full beneits of the act "up to the latest posible date." While not guaranteeing he declared that the policy will to see that the miners obtain to he finish the price of one dollar per unce, 1,000 fine, for their product.
