

ROANOKE FAIR OF 1924 BIDS WELL TO EXCEL ALL PREVIOUS RECORDS.

Increase in Premiums in all Departments; Added Free Acts; Wonderful Display of Fireworks; Best Poultry Department To Be Found

The Roanoke Fair, at Williamston, N. C. will open its gates to the people of the entire Roanoke Section, Monday night at 8 o'clock, it being the Third Annual Roanoke Fair.

Reviewing the history of the Roanoke Fair for the past three years, we find it at the beginning rated with the leading fairs of North Carolina. Gradually growing better year by year it has maintained this rating until now it is one of the leading fairs in the State of North Carolina.

Using the contracts and preparations as a base it can, justly, be said that the Roanoke Fair of 1924 bids well to excel all previous records. No exception has been spared in making this fair the greatest ever and no task has been left unturned that would interfere with the progress of the fair. The management has worked unceasingly for the past several months, trying to offer to the people of this section something worth while in the way of educational exhibits—not forgetting in the least, the children's part-amusements. No contracts were signed without a personal interview first being made and merits and features of same being weighed. In fact, a standard was set at the beginning and everything had to measure up to that standard before final arrangements were made.

Speaking a word about the amusement part, we are glad to announce that the midway will be of a clean and wholesome nature—fun and more fun but that which is had without embarrassment to anyone. A midway that a mother, a child and sister can see and not feel ashamed of, is one way we recommend it to you. The Madison Square Garden Band comes to our fair with the highest of recommendations. This band is from New York City and has as an accompanist a lady soloist. The band will render programs each day and night.

Free acts, also. Those that are different and of the highest and best type obtainable will be staged between each race. There will be a full program of races with a County Fair feature on Friday.

Each night, in addition to band concert and free act program in front of the grand stand, there will be the most spectacular display of fireworks ever presented to the public by a district fair. The Battle of Verdun will

be featured. In this battle over 70,000 shells will be fired and there will be tanks in action in the battle. Two programs daily of fire works, one at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, the other at 8 o'clock in the evening.

With 20 shows on the midway added to the above and with a few we failed to mention, there will be enough amusement and of such a varied nature that no one will go unsatisfied.

Turning to the various departments, we find departments that would do credit to any fair in the country. And while we try and describe them the best we are able, we fall far short in so doing.

Poultry Department

The Roanoke Fair Poultry Department last year won national fame, birds winning premiums here going to New York and winning premiums there. This department is one of the largest of its kind in the State and it doesn't lag but leads.
