The authors of the plays winning first, and third places in the State contest will be awarded prizes senty-five, ten, and five dellars respectively. They are then eligivin one of the eight prizes offered by the National Associate which range from ten to one hundred dollars, but which are awarded to the echools, not the individuals. as represented by the plays submitted. The plays winning entrance to the National contest will be judged by David Belasco, dean of American Dramatists and Producers; Bachel Crothers, distinguished playwright; Nina Wilcox Putnam, famous woman humorist; and Dr. Chae. J. Hatfield, physician, educator, ident of the National Tuberculosis Association.

The plays winning in the State contest have an unusual oppor-ty of winning the National prizes, as North Carolina furnished colorful dramatic possibilities than any other State. Too, the ity the students have of regeiving the criticism and suggesfrom the Carolina Playmakers and their Director, and the fo-of attention on these subjects, should stimulate interest not only in dramatic art and composition, but in health habits, and should the hygienic habits in the students; a factor that cannot be over d.
