## GOOD WORK OF COLORED SANATORIUM

Sanatorium, N. C., December 11.—North Carolina realizes the importance of caring for her colored tuberculous citizens. The colored division of the North Carolina Sanatorium was opened in October 1923. It is a splendidly built, modern structure, modeled on the same lines as the unit for white patients. It accommodates 64 patients, an equal number of men and women. It is under the medical direction of the same physicians as the white division of the Sanatorium. The patients have all the advantages of the x-ray, splendid laboratory, and special treatments offered tuberculous persons at the State Sanatorium.

Tuberculosis is more common among negroes in North Carolina than in any other section of the country. In the Sanatorium it is very necessary for

among whites. The death rate for colored people in 1923 was 155.5 per hundred thousand; it was 66.3 per hundred thousand for whites. From both an economic and a humanitarian standpoint it is of great importance for the State to care for its tuberculous colored citizen. They go into the homes of white people as cooks, washwomen, maids, chauffeurs, and even as nurses of small children. Active and unknown tuberculosis among negroes is often a source of infection for white people.

The opinion is prevalent that negroes do not respond to sanatorium treatment. This is not true. It has been the experience of the doctors at the North Carolina Sanatorium that cases taken early enough and given proper treatment respond to it almost as well as white patients do. While undergoing treatment at the

patients to get the full benefit of the treatment. There are a number of small things that help to make the life of sanatorium patients and the long period of treatment pass pleasantly. Books and music are two of these things, nor does the State make any appropriation for them. Books of fiction, biography, history and travel to form a library for the colored sanatorium, and a talking machine with a number of good records are needed at the colored division now. Any one wishing to contribute any of these things may send them to the North Carolina Sanatorium, marked "Colored Division."

Heretofore one of the great difficulties in the treatment of tuberculosis among negroes, even more so than among whites, has been getting the disease diagnosed in its early stages. The North Carolina Sanatorium now employs two whole-time traveling clinicians. These physicians hold clinics for examination of both white and colored free of charge in any town or country in which their services are requested.

## NORTH CAROLINA MID- MONTH FARM NOTES

While the weather in December has been most variable, it has permitted considerable field work. No serious freezes have occurred that would injure small grains. The fall has been much warmer than usual. As reporters from almost all parts of the State have said, "The past month has been relatively warm and good for farm work. Light rains have occurred in many sections."

Soils have been in good condition for crop growth and the planting of small grains. There is plenty of moisture.

### Crop Harvests

While almost all crops have been harvested, there is still considerable corn in fields and unpecked cotton is frequently seen in the northern part of the State.

### Cotton

The conspicuous remark in relation to cotton is "While there is less than 10 per cent of cotton left in field, yet there is a small amount still unpicked," as reported from all districts. Of course, the unpicked lint is becoming dingy and losing rapidly in quality and grade. Higher prices for picking are necessary for harvesting this time of the year.

### Tobacco

Most of the crop has been sold at

quiet satisfactory prices. November averaged \$28.44 per hundred pounds for all sales on auction floors.

### Corn

Most reports indicate that from 5 to 15 per cent of the corn is still in fields and mostly on the stalks. More than the usual amount of corn had leaf fodder and tops taken from it. The grain proved to be better than was expected prior to harvest.

### Winter Feeds

There is a recognized shortage of winter feeds in most parts of the State, but particularly so in the eastern and southern counties where summer weather conditions were quite adverse.
