GASOLINE PRICES AGAIN ADVANCED

ADVANCE OF 2 CENTS A GALLON IS MADE IN NORTH CAROLINA

New York, Jan. 14.—The Standard Oil Co., of New York, announced today that the price of gasoline will be raised two cents a gallon in New York and New England States, making the new tank wagon price 17 cents a gallon and 20 cents at filling stations. Naptha prices will be raised 1 cent at the same time.

The Gulf Refining Co. will advance the price of gasoline 2 cents in North Carolina, and 1-1/2 cents in South Carolina.
