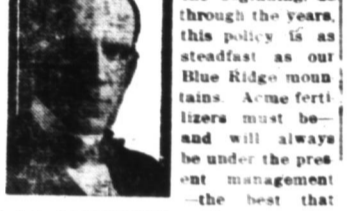


FLAG OF HONOR NAILED TO MAST
