

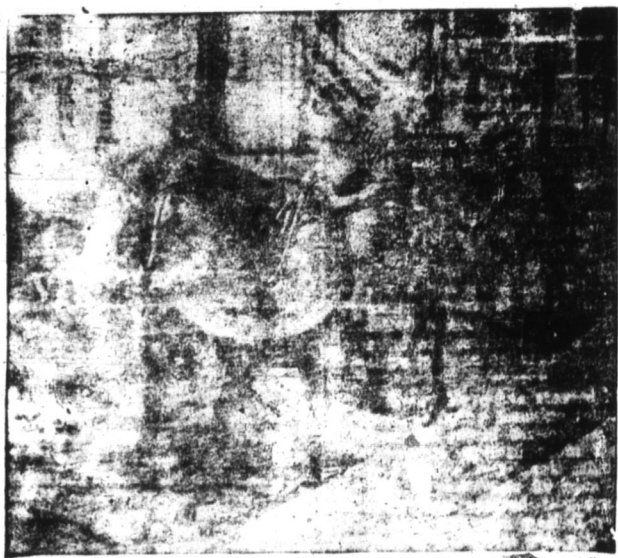

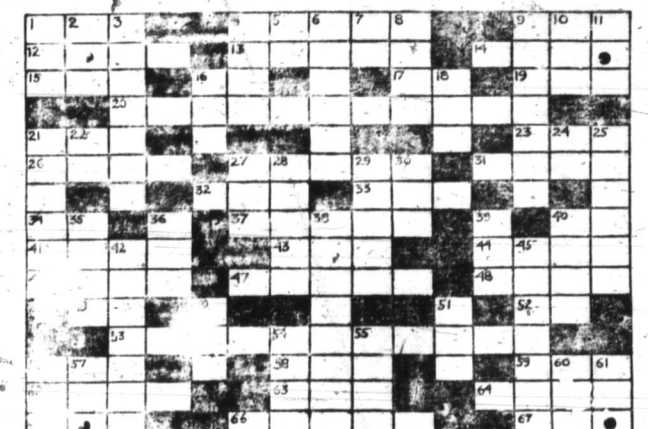
Conditioning the Farm Horse
