And stopped my darling's immortal breath.

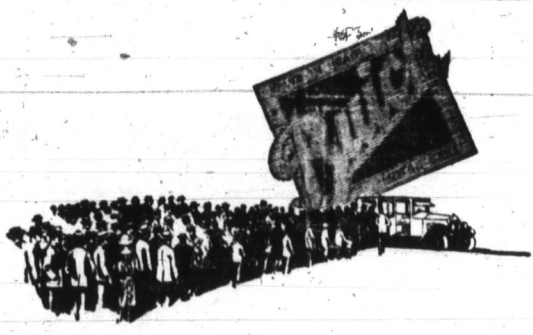
He gently bore his suffering and pain;
