NOTICE OF SPECIAL TAX ELEC.

Powell School District, Martin County, North Carolina. In compliance with the wishes of a petition signed by a necessary number of qualified voters of Powell school

district, which was duly approved by the board of education of Martin County, and in accordance with the provisions of Article 1 of the new School Code of 1925

Notice is hereby given that the election will be held at Old Powell Schoolhouse, in Powell School District, on the 16th day of November, 1925, in said Powell School District, which is described hereinafter, for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the qualified voters of said district as to whether a majority of such voters favor the levying and collecting annually of a special tax with which to supplement the funds for six months public school appropriated by the board of education, and annexation of Powell School District to Gold Point school district, the rate of said special tax not to exceed a maximum of 30 cents on the \$100 valuation of all property, real and personal, within the bounds of the district, described as follows:

"Beginning in Huskanaw Swamp at the Thos. Norwood line; thence down Huskanaw Swamp to fork of Huska-

naw and Ross Swamps; thence up the Ross Swamp to H. A. Johnson line; thence with H. A. Johnson and Arden Everett line to Thos. Norwood line; thence with Thos. Norwood line to the beginning."

At said election, those who are in favor of the levy and collecting annually of a special tax of not more than 30 cents on the \$100 valuation and the annexation of Powell School District to Gold Point School District shall vote a ticket on which shall be written or printed the words, "For Local Tax," and those who oppose the levy and collection annually of a spec-

ial tax of not more than 30 cents on the \$100 valuation and annexation of Powell School district to Gold Point School District, shall vote a ticket on which shall be written or printed the words, "Against a local tax."

That Mr. John A. Powell be and is hereby appointed registrar, and Mr. J. R. Winslow and Mr. H. T. Brown are hereby appointed poll holders for said election.

That a new registration is hereby ordered and that the registration books will be open for such purposes beginning with the 5th day of October 1925, and will continue open until the

7th day of November, 1925. The registrar will be at his home during the above dates for the purpose of registering all those qualified to vote in said district.
