### BOOK REVIEW

"The New Decalogue of Science."  
By Albert Edward Wiggam. \$3.  
Bobbs-Merrill Co., Indianapolis.  
This is a scientific book, written especially for the man in the street. While it deals with profound concepts and sets forth much of the progress in the scientific realm, it is written in non-technical language.

There are a very few ways to be informed about what is going on in the scientific world, and the best way is to read about it. Mr. Wiggam, who is a well-known lecturer, is also a forceful writer.

One will not, of course, agree with all that he says, just as one never agrees with everything that anybody says. But this book will give one a scientific "jerk."

From the title, it will be seen that he deals with the ten commandments of science.
