all modern equipment, hardwood finish, and will be used for housing the waiters, when the hotel, soon to be built, is completed. Rocks are rapidly being placed on the ground to build the structure, which is to be of the Grove Park Inn type.

From Pompey's Knob Mount Mitchell lies to the southwest and in full view on the other side is Table Rock, as well as many other of the most

interesting peaks of the Blue Ridge. Little Switzerland is the only village in sight and only a few miles away. It is no trouble to fall in love with a country which displays such wondrous beauty. The rocks, the hills covered with mountain laurel, spruce balsam, and the sweet and beautiful rhododendron and many other fragrant flowers.
