**Tornado Sweeps Over Northern Arkansas**

A tornado of great fury swept through several counties in Northern Arkansas yesterday, destroying hundreds of buildings; and, according to incomplete reports, 13 people were killed. Two small towns, Heber Springs and Opelo, were practically laid flat.

The Red Cross and other relief agencies are rushing assistance in the form of food, clothing, nurses and medical aid, and are all taking care of the dead.

The storm struck these towns about 5.30, and other sections south of this region may have suffered from the tornado, as news could not be gotten from them on account of wires being down.

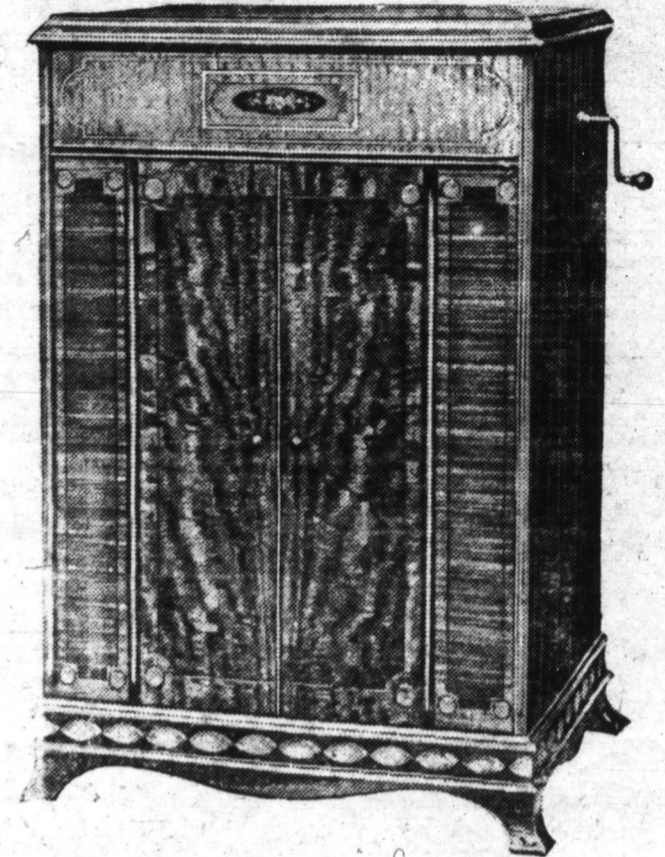

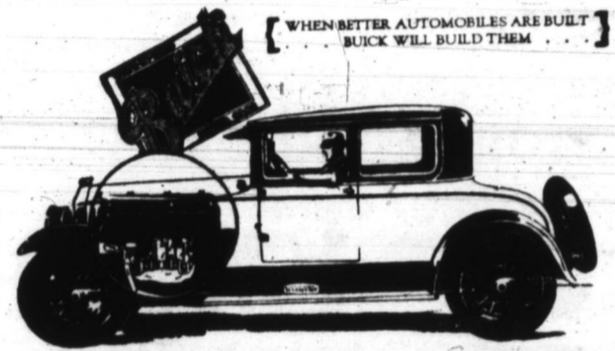
