**Sentenced Bazemore To Die January 26th**

Yelverton and who later returned alone on the same truck.

Mr. Simpson, who unloaded the tobacco from the truck in Farmville, testified that Bazemore was the man who carried the truck of tobacco there. Bazemore told him that the tobacco was his, but it was stated by Mr. Simpson that the negro did not wait for the check and that he left without the truck.

Sheriff Roberson and Chief of Police Daniel testified to statements Bazemore had made to them, all indicating the negro's guilt.

While the man was convicted on circumstantial evidence, the case presented the most complete proof of any ever tried in the State. The defendant offered no explanation whatever for the deed, but sat motionless throughout the trial, knowing well that his life was limited.

Bazemore's father had Paul Frazier, of Snow Hill to defend his son, but no witnesses were placed on the stand in his son's behalf. The State was represented by Solicitor Davis, of New Bern.

The murder took place on the morning of November 5, when Bazemore and the boy were on their way to Wilson with a load of tobacco. It has been described as one of the most brutal murders ever committed in this part of the State.

Gordon Yelverton, a seventeen-year-old boy, was making his home here with his uncle, Mr. Z. H. Rose, and was working for him when he was killed.
