NOTICE OF A SPECIAL TAX ELECTION IN BIGGS SCHOOL DISTRICT, MARTIN COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA.

IN COMPLIANCE with the wishes of a petition signed by a necessary number of qualified voters of BIGGS SCHOOL DISTRICT, NUMBER 20, WHITE, which was duly approved by the BOARD OF EDUCATION OF MARTIN COUNTY and in accordance with the provisions of Article 17 of the New School Code of 1913.

NOTICE is hereby given that the election will be held at the School House of said district on the 31st day of January 1927, in said district, which is described hereinafter, for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the qualified voters of the BIGGS SCHOOL DISTRICT as to whether the majority of such voters favor the levying and collecting annually, of a special tax to supplement the regular tax levied for public school purposes, as authorized by the BOARD OF EDUCATION, the rate of the special tax not to exceed a maximum of 35 cents on the \$100 valuation of all property, real and personal, within the bounds of the District described as follows:

"BEGINNING at a point on the old Williamston to Greenville Road where Reedy Swamp crosses it, and following said swamp and Bear Grass Special School Tax District Line to the mouth of Pig Pen Branch and Bear Trap Mill Pond; thence along Little Creek to Sweetened Water Creek to a point where the Williamston Special Tax District Line strikes the said Sweetened Water Creek; thence along the Williamston Special Tax District Line a westerly course to the point where the New Road, a dirt Road, branches southwesterly from the Williamston to Washington hard-surfaced road, being a point about a quarter of a mile from Skewarke Church Grove South; thence southwesterly along the New Road, a dirt road to its intersection with the Williamston-Greenville Road; thence along to Williamston to Greenville Road to the beginning point."

AT SAID ELECTION, those who are in favor of the levy and collecting, annually, of a Special Tax of not more than 35 cents on the \$100 valuation of all property in said District as aforesaid, shall vote a ticket on which shall be written or printed the words "FOR LOCAL TAX", and those who oppose the levy and collecting, annually, of a Special Tax of not more than 35 cents on the \$100 valuation in said District as aforesaid, shall vote a ticket on which shall be printed or written the words "AGAINST A LOCAL TAX".

THAT D. O. BOWEN be and is hereby appointed REGISTRAR, and

A. F. Taylor and W. L. Taylor are hereby appointed Pollholders for said election.

THAT a new registration is hereby ordered and that the registration books will be open for such purposes beginning with the 18th day of December 1926, and will continue open until the 22nd day of January, 1927. The registration will be at home of D. O. Bowen during the above dates for the purpose of registering all those qualified to vote in said District.
