

Frigidaire Now Selling At Lowest Cost Ever

General Motors' rapid progress in forcing down production costs and lessening the price of electric refrigeration to the customer is well illustrated by a recent announcement of a new Frigidaire, selling at the lowest price in the history of the business, according to O.
