Start Mailing License **Blanks** Out Monday

Commencing Monday, application blanks for automoboile licenses will be placed in the mails at the rate of 50,000 per day by the automobile license bureau of the State department of revenue, according to Sprague Silver, director of the bureau.

It is estimated that a blank will have been mailed to virtually every automobile owner in the State by June 1.

New licenses will go on sale here June 1, and the managers of the several branches distributing licenses are urging all auto owners to purchase their plates early in order to avoid a great rush around the first of July. The new licenses will be in effect for only six months, and will sell for one-half the usual amount plus an additional 25 cents. That is, where you paid \$12.50 last June for a light-car license, you will pay only \$6.50 this year.


