WEEVILS INFEST NEARLY HALF COTTON IN STATE

Southeastern Part of State Especially Hard Hit, Says State's Statistician

Serious infestation by the boll weev il in southeastern North Carolina, and along the South Carolina border was reported yesterday by Frank Parker State-Federal agricultural statistician, who has completed a partial survey of

The southeastern sections shows greatest damage, according to Parker's report, and if rainy weather continues the worst damage ever exper ienced in the State from the ravages of the insect may be expected. Wayne. County showed first infestation of the section, according, to Parker, with many fields running over 50 per cent damages. Dusting, now being practiced, is having little effect as a de-

"Weather conditions have been very favorable," Parker says, "for a maximum propagation and damage. Too many farmers are not taking the weevil seriously enough and are therefore as it is advisable. A large percentage of the young bolls already opened are being seriously attacked in the main or central North Carolina coton belt

Boll weevil damage had a big share in lowering the August 1 government cotton forecast, and the September 1 report may show a very much poorer condition, due to weevils, according to the present outlook.
