England has learned this, as shown in the report of Lord Rothermere, who, when he made his report to the British people after heading a commission to this country, the main purpose of which was to learn the reason of our amazing prosperity, said: "The economic welfare of the United States is based more than anything else upon the fact that she has 29,000,000 horsepower of electricity established in her factories—a force that is estimated as the equivalent of 290,000,000 human workers."
