### American Tariffs Hit a Snag in Cuba

The American tariff schedules, which have so generously protected the big interests and which have given them vast wealth by such protection, seem to be sailing among rocks down in Cuba.

Our policy, which has prohibited by a high tariff wall all goods from other countries that we could produce ourselves, and at the same time attempts to force the same countries to receive our goods into their countries free, is causing a kick which we will not long be able to resist.

If America is to carry on a large trade with the Central and South American countries, in which we buy lots of goods from them and they buy lots of goods from us, then nothing but a fair tariff exchange should prevail. If we charge them too high import duty, it will not be fair to ask that they receive our goods to their markets free. If we do, then they will very soon be too poor to trade with us.

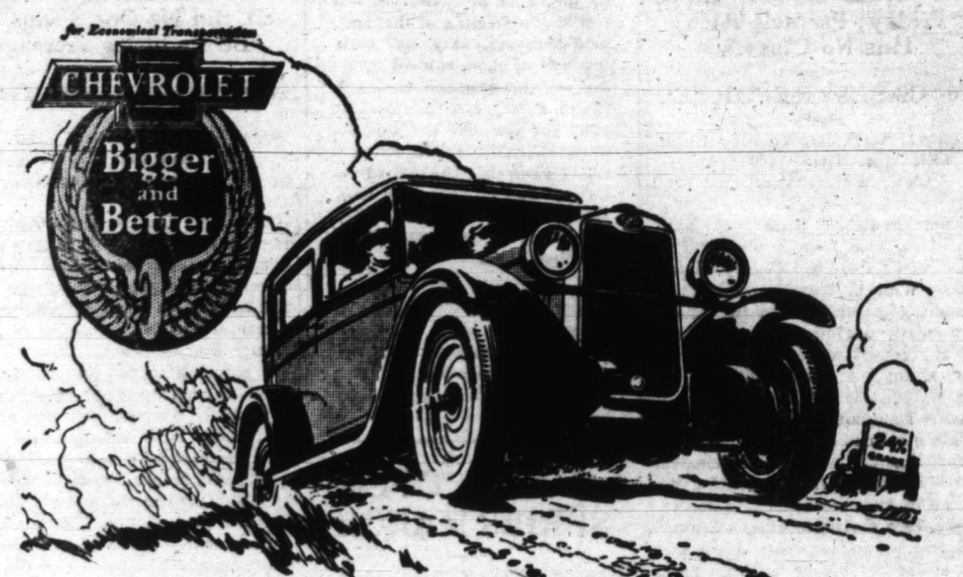
