## TO RAISE \$100,000 FOR NEAR EAST

### Conference of Volunteer Workers Held Recently At Durham

Durham, N. C., Feb. 29.—That the recent State conference of volunteer workers in this city will bear fruitful results for the Near East College Association is expressed by Lieut. Gov. J. Elmer Long, of this city, chairman of the movement in North Carolina. Evidence of this is seen through the more ready contributions being made as a result of this conference, and this increased interest is considered the fruit of a more intimate knowledge on the part of the people as to the work of the association in the Near East. Six college institutions in the Near East, all having a common task, have pooled their interests, and their cause is being presented to America not separately but together. World leaders have declared any contribution is an investment in international good will, and a hearty response is being seen all over America.

The goal in North Carolina has been set at \$100,000, which is only a small portion of the total campaign fund of \$15,000,000. The goal of Virginia, our sister State, has been placed at \$150,000. Governor Long is most hopeful of the campaign in this State. Leaders in public, religious, and educational life, including Angus W. McLean, governor of North Carolina, Dr. W. P. Few, president of Duke University, Dr. J. W. Smith, pastor of Trinity Methodist Church, this city, Josephus Daniels, Secretary of the Navy under Woodrow Wilson, and others, have heartily endorsed the Near East College Association cause.

Reports being received from various localities through the State, such as cities and counties, give every reason, declares Captain Claude W. Hopper, southern director of the movement in the United States, to believe that the Tar Heel State will do her proportional part in the great humanitarian work of extending the opportunity of education to the younger generation in the Near East.

Every contributor is personally credited with the amount given, and a complete list will be published at a later date. Such names as Cyrus McCormick and Chauncey M. Depew are included in the liberal contributors, and Governor Long has enjoined the people of this State to aid this great cause, a cause which has interested the leading men of this age.

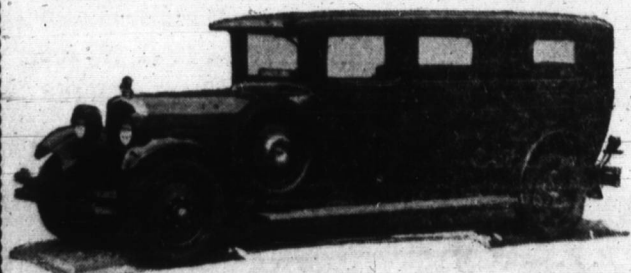
