COUNTY AGENT-REVIEWS WORK

County Farmers Save Over \$2,000 By Cooperative Buying and Selling

County Agent T. Brandon paid his salary and provided for expenses of the office for many months to come with his activities during February, saving the farmers of the county \$2,294.40 in actual cash, aside from the assistance offered in several other branches of farm demonstration work. These savings, resulting through cooperative shipments and purchases, were: Poultry, \$935; three cars of drain tile, \$403.90; and a car of dynamite \$955.50. Other activities during the past month reported to the county commissioners at their meeting here this week include: 19 days spent in field work; 5 days spent in office work; 111 office conferences; 95 telephone calls; 154 letters written; 42 farms visited; 771

miles traveled during the month; 3 articles written for local papers; 247 hogs treated.

A part of the month was devoted to pruning and spraying orchards. 12 pecan trees were ordered, making a total of 62 trees ordered during the year. Also some time was devoted to testing land to see if it would be advisable to use lime.

Small Fire Yesterday Causes Excitement

A fire alarm coming from the home of G. T. Hill, colored, yesterday afternoon, while a strong wind was blowing over the town, caused much excitement here, especially among the colored residents in the region of the alarm's origin. Sparks from a chimney, fanned by the wind, started a small blaze on the side of the shingled roof, but the damage was negligible. A bucket of water stopped the blaze, and the town's fire host was not used.

President Calls Extra Session of Congress

Congress has been called by President Hoover to meet in extra session on the 15th day of April.

The particular need for a special session of the body mentioned in the call is farm relief and tariff revision. According to many, some kind of farm measure will be passed, whether

good or bad, something will have to be done, the politicians are understood to say.

Farmers are generally suspicious of the tariff. They are saying "the peanut duty seemed to lower the prices and they cannot understand it. Some predict that the manufacturers will get a tariff to protect his interests and the farmer will get relief that will not do him much good."

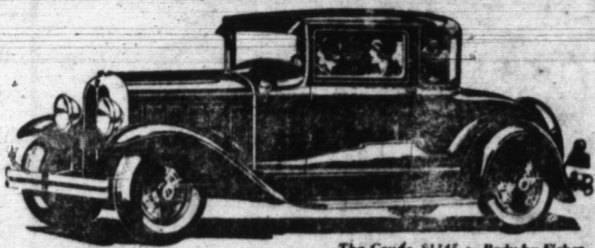
