(Continued from page one) relegating him from office. On the other hand, the board intimated that Mr. Moore would certainly be favored as appointee to the post of county warden and that there would not be such an awful amount of difference in the salaries of county and district wardens.

Mr. Worthy seems to feel that the East ought to have more than one district warden. Other individuals feel the same way about it. It may be that the board will eventually agree to the establishment of four districts, instead of three. Originally there were eleven districts. This number was cut to six, then to five, and now to three. Mr. Moore, when seen yesterday, had very little to say concerning the matter. He said he was criticizing nobody and that he had no fault to find. He admitted that he liked the work of district warden very much and hated to discontinue it.

"But all that is up to the commission," he pointed out, "and I have nothing to say in the matter."
