Crust—Uniform golden brown, crisp and smooth.
Taste and odor—Sweet nutty flavor and odor, no suggestion of sourness or taste of yeast.
Texture and grain—Tender, but not crumbling, fine mesh of equal size throughout.
Moisture—Slightly moist, yet springy and elastic when pressed lightly with the finger.
Color—Creamy white.
Lightness—Well raised, equally light throughout, absence of heavy spots or streaks, not heavy for size.
