Arm Wounds Tells Story Of a Big Hawk's Death

Macon, Ga., Jan 3.—Deep wounds on the right wrist of Dr. O. F. Keen, Macon surgeon, today told a dramatic story of the death throes of a chicken hawk whose wing spread was five feet and nine inches.

Dr. Keen shot the bird while on a hunting trip and it hurtled to the ground. Thinking it dead he touched it, whereupon its talons closed around his wrist in a vice so strong that he could not release their grip.

Finally, one of the hunters cut off the hawk's legs, and Dr. Keen was then able to free himself.
