**Insurance Price Discriminations**

Comparative figures on the cost of insurance under the workman's compensation act in North Carolina and Ohio show that our State is discriminated against without mercy.

In Ohio, the state administers the affairs and even with the very low rate charged there they have laid aside a very large sum for the insurers. In North Carolina, the money-making insurance companies charge twice as much as the State of Ohio charges, and give less benefits, and pocket the difference.

This is a shocking blow to the fellows who say private institutions can beat the government in managing business.

The figures are listed below. Which will you take, those of the State of Ohio government or those of the privately-managed, blood-sucking insurance people who come to North Carolina? Here they are:
