LIST OF FOODS ESSENTIAL DAILY

Leaflet Being Distributed In County by Home Demonstrator

A list of daily food essentials, prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture, was recently issued in leaflet form and distributed by Miss Pratt Covington, home demonstration agent, throughout the county.

Following are the items suggested to be eaten for growth and health:

- Milk: 1 pint to 1 quart daily. Vegetables: 3 servings daily, including 1 starchy vegetable, such as potatoes; 1 leafy vegetable, such as collards, cabbage, turnip greens; and 1 other vegetable, such as beets, carrots, onions. Fruits: 2 servings daily, fresh, canned, or dried. It is also advised "Be sure to use a raw fruit, a raw vegetable, or canned tomatoes daily. Eggs: 1 daily. Meat (lean): 1 serving daily, pork, beef, mutton, poultry, or fish. Whole grains: 2 servings daily: breakfast cereal, such as oatmeal, cracked wheat, bread, as cornbread, whole wheat bread. Fats: 2 tablespoonfuls of butter daily in addition to other fats in food. Sweets: 1 serving daily. Water: 6 to 8 glasses.
