Restoring Small Town Business

Some of the secrets of restoring small town business, where it has shown signs of decadence, were pointed out by Dr. Julius Klein in a recent radio address to be found in a brisk resolute modernization program for the stores, the introduction of more rigid efficiency, remodeling or even transformation of equipment and arrangements, the installing of stock-control systems, the careful training of sales people, co-operative advertising, chamber of commerce activity, and the creation or arousal of keener civic consciousness.

One of the most potent weapons available to the small town merchant, the speaker pointed out, is the trade-developing power of local advertising media. "Certainly, intelligently guided publicity and consistently vigorous local advertising, especially in these days of consumer timidity, represent outstanding means at the command of the smaller-community merchant for arousing greater interest in his goods and attracting customers to his store,-Cadillac (Mich.)
