The Woman's Missionary Society of the Methodist Church will meet on Wednesday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock at the church. All members are requested to be present.

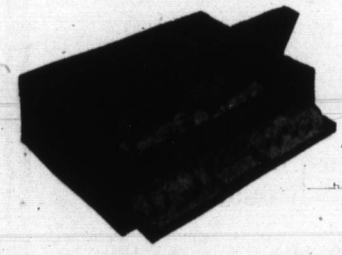
From Washington
