Robersonville, October 19.—T. T. Cox, a former auto salesman of the Cox Motor Company here, continues in the Edgecombe County jail in default of bond required following an automobile accident in Tarboro on Monday evening of last week. Louis Phipps, white man, was killed by Cox's car as he was working on a truck in front of his home.

According to reports reaching here Cox had had several violent attacks of kidney colic for a few days just prior to the accident. He says he suffered a violent attack on the road near Co-netoe, and, unable to find a doctor there he continued on to Mildred, where he procured two drinks of li-
