JAIL COUNTY MAN FOR THEFT AT GOLDSBORO

Grover Phelps Accused of Stealing Rings From Woman

Grover Phelps, employee in a local cafe, was carried to Goldsboro last Saturday to answer in a case charging him with the robbery of two diamond rings from a woman near that town the night before Christmas. It was learned here that he was identified by the woman, and that he is being held for trial in the Wayne Superior court.

Traveling in the Goldsboro section Phelps and Johnnie James stopped to offer assistance to some people who had been in an auto wreck. The two men were asked to take the woman to a hospital in Goldsboro. James drove the car and Phelps held the woman in the back seat. The woman claims that while on the way to the hospital Phelps removed the two rings from her finger, that she was in such a condition that she could neither speak or prevent the removal of her rings. She further claims that upon her arrival at the hospital she told nurses of the robbery, but the defendant heard nothing about the charge until officers came here armed with a warrant for his arrest. James and Phelps gave their names and addresses to policemen and continued to their homes here. When the woman had sufficiently recovered she had a warrant sworn out for Phelps, maintaining he had robbed her of the rings.

Mr. James says he knows nothing about the alleged robbery, as he was driving rapidly. He neither heard nor saw anything in connection with the alleged robbery.
