HINTS FOR HOMEMAKERS

"What To Do With Olives"

If you have always thought of olives as just a convenient and popular appetizer, often served with celery and passed "as is", you will hear with enthusiasm that olives are the life of the menu when properly garbed and presented. Olives are the most adaptable little food in the world for many times and many places. Their flavor is one of the finest when used in sauces, salads, savories, dressings or aspic.

Tartar Sauce
To 1 cup mayonnaise add three green and three ripe olives, cut very fine, two sour pickles, chopped, two tablespoons chopped pepper and one-half teaspoon paprika.

Russian Dressing
To two cups mayonnaise, add three tablespoons chili sauce, one section Roquefort cheese well broken up, six or eight olives cut fine, a small onion chopped and a little chopped pimento. Beat well and serve on lettuce hearts.

Hors D'Oeuvres
Take as many rounds of toast sauted in olive oil or butter as desired, or use artichoke hearts, marinated in French dressing. On each round place on extremely thin slice of Spanish onion, on top of the onion thin slices of ripe olives, over these a slice of tomato and Sauce Tartare. Around the edge of the canape pipe some parsley butter, made by creaming two tablespoons butter with one or two teaspoons chopped parsley, and decorate the hors d'oeuvre platter or service with chilled ripe olives.


