in an address to be delivered over a state radio hook-up Thursday night of this week.

Questions on the tobacco situation, the possibility of road refunds and the proposed radio system, three matters claiming immediate attention of Martin citizens just now, crowded other issues, probably of greater state-wide interest, into the background, but the candidate for governor said he would leave no doubt in the minds of any one where he stood on all questions when he faces the microphone this week.

Murder Case Hearing To Be Held Here Tomorrow

Ben Scott and Willie Melton, both colored, will be given a hearing in Justice J. L. Hassell's court here tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock in connection with the murder of Henry Lanier, colored man, here the middle of last month.

While Scott faces a charge of murder, Melton, only 16 years of age, will be arraigned for accessory before the fact, it is understood.

Scott, just recently recovered from an attack of pneumonia in a Washington hospital, is now in the county jail here.

Man Arrested for Alleged Violation of the ABC Act

Mack Peterson, colored man, was arrested here Sunday morning for the alleged violation of the ABC act. He is appearing in the county court today.

Peterson was arrested following a long automobile chase by Sheriff Roebuck. A companion, riding with Peterson, jumped from the car and outdistanced Roy Peel in a mile-long course. Peterson is alleged to have had 5 gallons of bootleg liquor aboard, but when the sheriff closed in on him, he cracked the container and the contraband flowed freely.

Fair-sized catches are being reported almost daily at Jamesville, and it is a matter of only a few days before fishing activities in the Roanoke will be underway on a large scale. No definite date for the opening of the fishery at Jamesville has been announced, but preparations are going forward rapidly with plans to start operations during week after next.

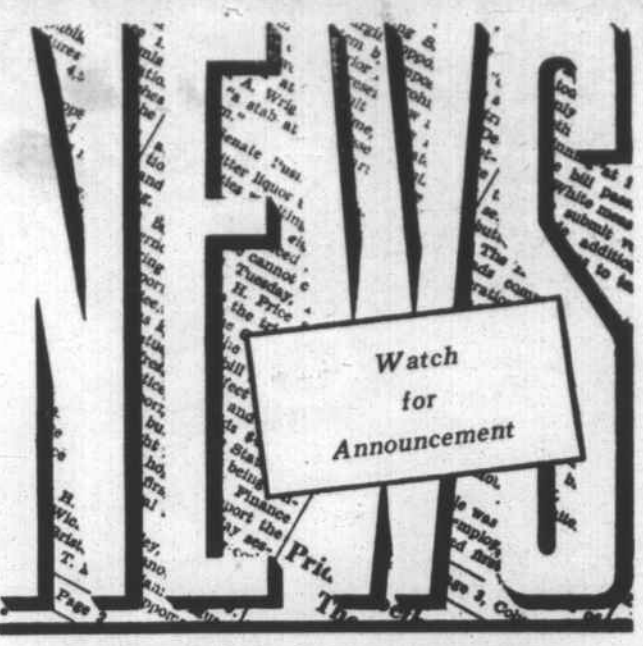
