**Remove Low Producing Hens To Boost Egg Price**

Peak production usually means low prices on eggs and this condition is natural at this time of the year. The logical method of correcting this trouble is to cull the flock and remove all the low producers. This will materially cut the feed bill and bring up the average production per bird. Another way is lay down a supply of eggs in water glass. Directions for this work may be secured by writing the Poultry Department at State College.
