Start dusting or spraying as soon tees: Courtesy, resolutions, and time as adult beetles become numerous, music. Robersonville and repeat every week or 10 days or as often as necessary. The spray County reports, Pitt and Washor dust must reach the undersides of the leaves.

Rotenone dust also is a good form of beetle control, he observed, and it is not harmful to human beings. The dust should contain threefourths of 1 per cent rotenone.

Poisoned Bordeaux powder and Address, Ralph Deal of Eastern rotenone dust are used in controlling flea beetles and cucumber beetles. Make several applications a week apart. The dust may be applied with a sack or a small hand duster.

Flea beetles often cause severe damage to potato, tomato, pepper, and egg plants. The cucumber Martin County report, Beaufort beetle stunts cucumber and melon plants.



Cull Breeding Birds When Ten to Twelve Weeks Old

Cockerels and pullets to be used as breeders should be selected when the birds are from eight to twelve weeks old. Select only those birds that show good health and high vitality. A broad, deep, well-balanc-ed head, prominent, bright eyes, full breast, and strong straight legs set squarely beneath the body indi-cate health and vigor. Watch the birds selected all through the growing season and those that lack vigor or are slow in developing should be discarded.


