BONUS PAYMENT FOR WAR VETS MOST COMPLETE

More Than Three Million Former Soldiers Receive Nearly Two Billion

Almost at the end of the big financial operation of paying the soldiers' bonus, United States Treasury officials estimated recently that the final figures would show a total of \$1,923,000,000 going to the veterans in either bonds or cash. Of that amount all but \$11,000,000 has gone out officials reported, adding that of 3,518,191 veterans originally eligible for the bonus, only 216,201 remained to be paid a

few days ago. All in all it was stated, \$1,726,432,950 has been issued to the former soldiers, supplemented by about \$78,000,000 in checks for add amounts. The figures were as of July 25.

A heavy lag was reported, however, between the receipt of the bonds and their conversion into cash by the veterans. Bonds to a total of \$1,018,000,000 had been redeemed, leaving the veterans still holding approximately \$700,000,000 worth.

While redemptions continued at a slow day-to-day rate, some officials interpreted this lag as meaning that many veterans intended to hold on to their bonds and receive three percent interest paid by the government. The bonds mature in 1945.

In arriving at the total cost to the government of paying the bonus, officials added other items to the amount paid the veterans, bringing that total to \$2,491,000,000.

This included \$507,000,000 to be paid to the government life insurance fund under the bonus, and \$60,000,000 to be paid to banks which had made loans to veterans on their bonus certificates.
