tory just completed. Other buildings erected during Dr. Kitchin's tenure of office are Wait hall (administrative building), the William Amas Johnson medical building, a \$200,000 gymnasium, and additions to the concrete stadium. Thus, with

an almost brand-new physical plant and a record enrollment of 1,800, this 103-year-old college, the oldest and largest Baptist college for men in the United States, has launched auspiciously into its second century of service.

ATTENTION PLANTERS

The prospects are very good for a favorable year for the production of cucumbers in 1937.

Last year 89 of our Growers averaged \$157.20 per acre, and 64 growers averaged \$154.80 per acre planted in cucumbers at Washington, N. C.

- Mr. W. S. Jackson produced 234 bushels on one acre planted and was paid \$154.58.
- Mr. Jos. Rhem produced 195 bushels per acre and was paid \$516.69 for the production on 3 acres of land.
- Mr. J. E. Roberson produced 197 bushels to the acre on 8 acres and received \$1,286.73.
- Mr. J. T. Moore produced 228 bushels to the acre planted and was paid \$762.28 for the product of 4 acres.

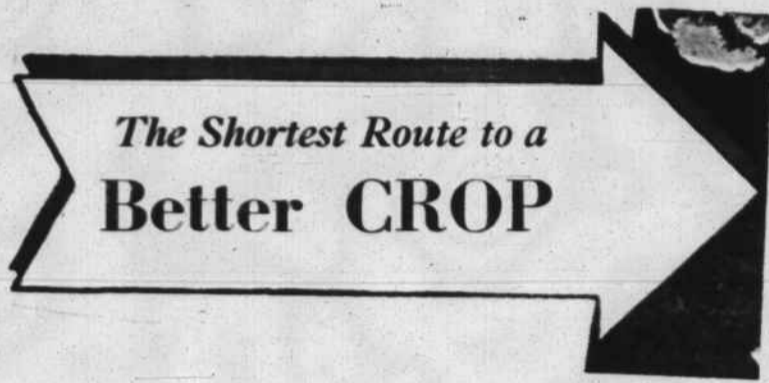
