# Tax Listing Notice

## List Your Property and Give in Your Poll During the Month of April

Notice is hereby given that, during the month of April, the list takers for all the townships in the county will be present at the various places advertised in each of the townships, for the purpose of receiving lists of taxable property.

Every person, firm and corporation must list their real and personal property with their local list taker. Also, all male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 years are required to list for poll tax. All persons who fail to list during the month of April all property owned by them on the first day of April, and all persons who are liable for poll tax and fail to list same during the month of April will be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction, fined or imprisoned.
