

Harold Ickes Warns Curb On 'Gasoline' May Become Drastic

Gasoline restrictions that eventually may rule out pleasure riding entirely may be expected in the eastern states within a month, according to Harold L. Ickes, newly-appointed Defense Oil Co-ordinator.

The consumer also may expect to pay higher prices for gasoline to offset the cost of new pipelines from the mid-continent to the eastern seaboard, first of which may be completed by December, Mr. Ickes said.

Emphasizing that the defense oil problem is not one of production, but of transporting oil to the East Coast now that the tanker fleet has been cut by one-fifth by transfers to Britain, Mr. Ickes predicted that the new restrictions would apply only to the eastern seaboard.

The appeal to the public to curtail its use of gasoline, Mr. Ickes said, would be on a voluntary basis at first. He said he had no desire to see ration cards issued by the Government.

Asked if it is fair for Americans to have to do without gasoline when Japan is getting oil from the United States, Mr. Ickes replied that was a question for the State Department to decide, adding he might have views on the subject but was not expressing them.

He pointed out, however, that the two questions were entirely separate since the oil problem today is one of transportation and not of supply. "We have plenty of oil," he declared. "Cutting out Japan or any section of this country wouldn't get oil to the East Coast."

The Federal Government will start clearing the right of way for new oil pipelines from oil fields to the East Coast as soon as Congress gives permission, Mr. Ickes said.

First pipeline, he said, might be a products line from the Wood River area in Illinois to the refineries in the Philadelphia or New York area.

He expressed a preference that private capital do the constructing, if possible.

Farm Commodity Prices Are Soaring

Housewives of North Carolina are now paying from 6 to 143 per cent more for seasonal meats, fruits and vegetables and seafoods compared with prices prior to the outbreak of hostilities in September, 1939, A. B. Harless, marketing specialist of the State Department of Agriculture, reported today.

Enlarged consumer purchasing power, low production yields as a result of the drought, plus Government financial support of certain commodities are the principal stimulating factors behind the price increase of most farm products," Harless said. "While it has not been determined what share of the abnormal increase paid for farm products is going to the grower, it is a known fact that farmers in general are receiving financial benefits from sales of most livestock and perishable products."

Harless explained that "while June prices are not exactly representative of market conditions for farm commodities compared with September, the upward price trend is definitely established."

Retail prices in early June compared with early September, 1939 prices, showing "representative percentage increases," were reported by Harless as follows:

Fish: (Retail) — porgies, 12 1-2; speckled trout, 43; croakers, 6; Spanish mackerel, 38.

Hogs: (Prices to farmer)—Rocky Mount, 39; Richmond, 38; Baltimore, 37; Chicago, 40.

Butter: 92 score, 42.

Cattle: (Prices to farmer)—Choice steers, 21; cows, all weights, 20; weaners, all weights, 6; bulls, all weights, 28.

Spring lamb: (Prices to farmer)—Good and choice, 25.

Fruits and vegetables: (Retail)—Apples, 18; beans, 15; sweet potatoes, 12; peppers, 106; spinach, 30; tomatoes, 143; corn, per dozen, 51.

Old Pork: (Retail)—Bacon sabs, 12; backs, 14; bellies, 22.

Workers To Forego Summer Vacations

New York—Curtiss-Wright Corp., one of the world's largest aviation companies, announced its 38,000 employees have agreed to go without their vacations this summer in order to speed airplane and engine production.

Guy W. Vaughan, president of the company, commented: "This expression of patriotism by our workers speaks for itself. It means that our employees have chosen to forego 'time out' in favor of sticking to their jobs."

"This demonstration of loyalty means that Curtiss-Wright will produce approximately 60 more airplanes, 280 more engines and 175 more propellers for defense than our production schedules would otherwise permit."

William S. Knudsen, head of the Office of Production Management, was notified in Washington on the aviation workers' action and replied, "My best and sincerest thanks for this supreme example of cooperation."

Curtiss-Wright, now operating 14 plants, expects to increase its present number of employees to at least 70,000 before the end of the year and to 90,000 next year.

The current rate of production in one factory, at Buffalo, N. Y., has been announced as "over 10 planes a day".
