The Baptists and Christians are staging a merry race for the top position in the City Softball Circuit, with Bill Spivey's men now only a half game behind the Baptists.

In the first game played last Tuesday night, the Baptists defeated the Episcopalians, 9-7, while the Christians edged out the Methoterians, 10-9 in a regular slugfest.

Baptists Win
The Baptists staged a five-run rally in the seventh inning to overcome the Episcopalians, who were leading 7-4 at the beginning of the last frame.

Hits by Stuart Critcher and Jack Saunders gave the Episcopalians their first run. They scored again in the second inning on an error and singles by Haywood Wynne and "Tite" Critcher, and counted three more in the third when Saunders was safe on an error, Pap Diem singled and Tom Skinner hit a home run. Skinner's triple and a wild pitch accounted for a run in the fifth, their final tally coming in the sixth when Jim Critcher tripled and came home on Wynne's single.

The Baptists did all their scoring in two innings, chalking up four in the second on triples by Shelton Hall and Howard Cone, mixed in with Julian Harrell's single, a wild pitch and two errors.

The five-run uprising in the final frame came when Flip Peel hit a single, Oswald Stalls followed with a single, but Dick Miller reached first by a fielder's choice. Two errors followed to let in four runs. Fred Taylor hit safely and scored on Hall's single and an error.

The Episcopalians outbit the winners 12-10, with lanky Tom Skinner getting a home run, triple and single for four times at bat. Jim Critcher and Haywood Wynne, both on the losing team, were next-best with two hits for three attempts.

Methos Continue Their Losing Ways Against Christians

Two-Run Homer in Extra Inning Proves the Necessary Margin

In the first extra-inning game of the season, the Methoterians flopped again in the late stages of the game and lost to the Christians 10-9 in the second game of the twin bill last Tuesday evening.

The Christians started off strong with two runs in the first inning as Jack Sullivan and Vernon Bunting doubled in rapid order and Parson Goff singled. But the Methos came back in the same frame to knot the count with an error, walk, a double steal, and singles by Jack Fitzgerald and Ernest "Matuzie" Mears.

Sullivan homered in the third to put the Christians ahead, but the Methos got hold of Jack Manning for five runs in the fourth by combining triples by D. V. Clayton and Dillon Cobb, singles by Fitzgerald and Mears and two costly errors.

In the sixth the Christians began closing in, counting twice on Goff's single, a walk and James Willis Ward's double. The Methos scored one in the sixth on singles by Fitzgerald and Mears and a wild pitch, but their opponents came back in the next inning to bring in three more scores when Sullivan and C. T. Robertson singled and came home on Bunting's double. Bunting scored on an error.

The Christians added two more in the extra inning when Thad Harrison gained life by an error and George Lee Roberson hit a home run. Thigpen hit for four bases for the Methos but that was all the scoring.

Both team got 15 hits. Jack Sullivan was the leader for the Christians with four for five, while Fitzgerald and Mears hit safely four out of five times for the losers.

On Monday, June 30, the Christians and Baptists will battle it out in the second game of a twin bill. The Christians could go ahead of the present league leaders, with a victory, while a win for the Baptists would strengthen their lead. This engagement promises to be a hard-fought and interesting battle.
