When Hitler was reported to have gone to his mountain retreat to soothe his nerves, it was immediately suggested that he was a sick man. Some said he had typhoid fever. Others said he was sorely troubled by chills and fever—chills in cold Russia and fever in hot Africa. Still others said he was suffering from an over-dose of fits given him by the Russians.
