Boy Scouts Report Their Activities

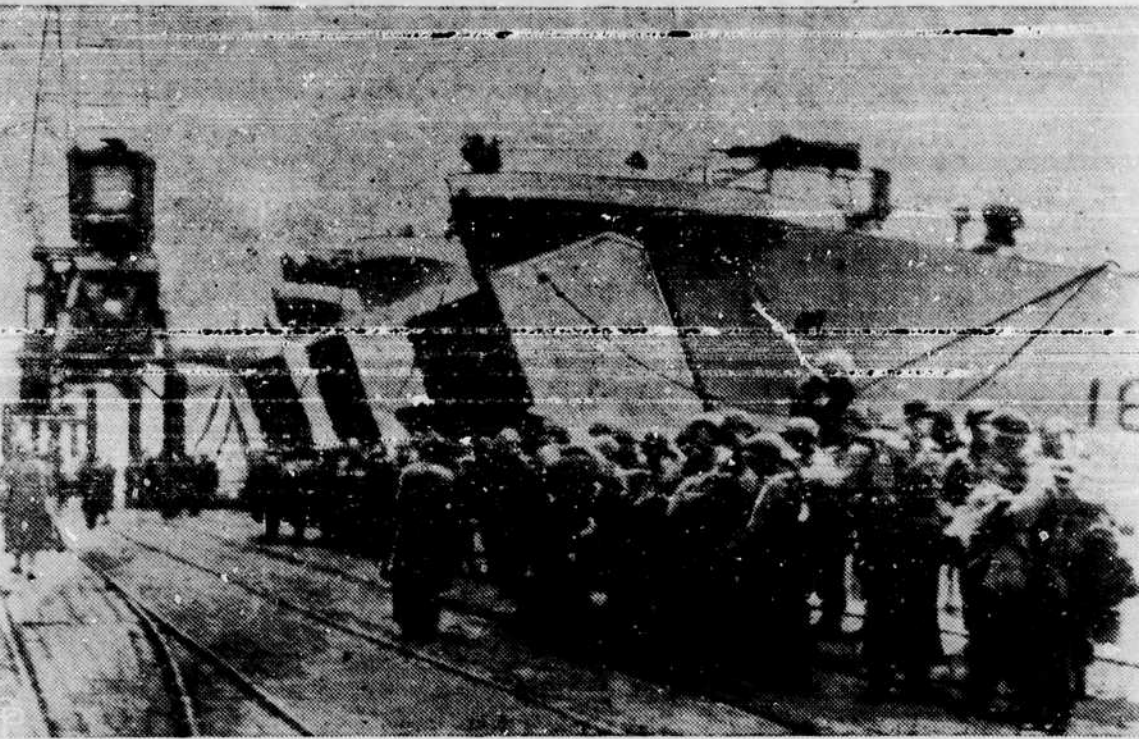
