Insurance Groups Make Many Loans

Life insurance companies now have more than \$4,000,000,000 invested in mortgages covering homes and housing for American families, an all-time peak for such financing aid. The companies are now prepared for a still greater role in post-war housing. At least one billion dollars will be available for new mortgages each year in the early post-war years.

There are now seven times as many people who own life insurance policies in the United States as there were in 1900. One-half the population now own policies, while only one-eighth owned them then.

Diseases of the heart and arteries constitute the No. 1 killer among life insurance policyholders today, accounting for nearly one-third of all policyholder deaths annually. The Life Insurance Medical Research Fund plans to make \$3,500,000 available over the next six years to get at the causes and cures of these diseases.

Farmers last year set a new peak in the purchase of life insurance. Countrywide, they bought nearly twice as much as in pre-war 1941.

The proportion of people keeping their life insurance policies in full force, in spite of financial emergencies, is today at an all-time high. Approximately 98% of all ordinary policies in force at the start of last

Children Afraid of Noise And Falling, Says Expert

Psychologists tell us that children appear to have only two basic fears, says Fred W. Kranz, Ph. D., director of research for the Sonotone Corporation, national hearing organization. "Young children are not afraid of snakes, mice and other similar things until the fears of parents have been transmitted to their young minds. But youngsters," says Mr. Kranz, "seem instinctively to be afraid of (1) a loud noise, and (2) falling. "It is of interest to note in this connection that the senses of balance and hearing are intimately associated. The inner ear has a sound apparatus called the Cochlea, and three arched semi-circular canals, which constitute the organ of balance, helping us to keep erect. The auditory nerve transmits sound impulses to
