Poor Source Of Help

British leaders state that the wholehearted help of France is needed for organizing Europe—against Russia, apparently.

Reports from France are not very encouraging, some declaring that the once great nation is almost ripe for communism, not as a result of Russian influence, but because of the rotten speck around the core. The leaders, including DeGaulle, are mad for power, and the people, out of necessity, are living from day to day rather than with a definite aim for a stabilized economy for tomorrow. A nation has just about hit bottom when its people fight over the butt of an American cigarette thrown into the gutter.

Facts for the Future

They say if you want to enjoy the future you should heed the past. It's another way of pointing out that experience is the best teacher.

We have just received some appalling statistics on street and highway accidents in 1946 from The Travelers Insurance Companies. If experience is the best teacher, these grim facts out of the immediate past are a precious lesson for all of us:

Two out of every three automobile accidents in the United States last year involved mistakes by drivers. Exceeding the speed limit took the heaviest toll—9,460 killed and 230,760 injured.

10,070 pedestrians were killed and 171,910 injured in 1946. Crossing between intersections was the most frequent cause of death and injury, accounting for more than 25 per cent of the casualties.

870 children were killed and 21,660 injured last year while they were playing in the street.

The vast majority of accidents last year—and any year—were caused by more or less experienced motorists who have had at least one year of driving experience.

Will you heed the past? Or will you be a statistic next year?

Technical Absurdity

A Texas court of appeals allowed a condemned man a new trial after he was convicted of kicking and stomping an aged woman to death. It isn't unusual for a high court to grant a new trial, but it would seem that the Texas court picked out a technical absurdity to support its action in the particular case. The court granted a new trial because the indictment did not say what the kicking and stomping was done with.

Some two years ago, the court set aside an indictment for drowning which failed to mention what liquid.

It is good to explore every angle when one's freedom is being tampered with, but the courts would do well to steer clear of absurdities.
