

### Use Of Alcohol On the Increase

In a recent issue the New York Times summarizes a report pubtrends in alcoholism by the Quarterly Journal of Studies of Alcohol. The study, which was written by Dr. E. M. Jellinek, of Yale University, puts the estimated number of consumers of alcohol in this country in 1945 at 58,250,-000 as compared with 42,900,000 in 1940. In the same period the per capita consumption of alcohol rose from 3.54 gallons of absolute alcohol (the actual amount of alcohol in distilled spirits, wine and beer) to 3.70 gallons, an increase of 4.5 percent.

stated, that in 1936, the first year when legitimate production of alcoholic beverages was sufficient to meet the demand, the consumption figures were 1.30 gallons of distilled beverages, .64 of wine and 17.53 of beer, or a consumption of 1.40 gallons of alcohol. 
