Moscow people could not sleep for the noise and Moscow policemen were instructed not to molest the Legionnaires just as New York policemen had been instructed. The Russian Legionnaires applauded when their speakers called for preparedness for any eventuality. The meeting, attracting mostly veterans from the old Czar's army and very few from the recent debacle, approved compulsory military training. And anyone who dared disagree with preparedness, military training and so forth was rated akin to a democrat.
