Shooting At One Another

One of the weakest planks in democratic governments is centered in those who continually and brazenly point out the problems and offer no solution or support in solving the problems.

Mr. Winston Churchill, enjoying the cooperation of most of the world in war, is now busy trying to wreck rather than help his own government. Reports state that he is missing no opportunity to emphasize his government's troubles.

His opposition, struggling along in one of the world's most perplexing economic periods, points out that Churchill's imperialism was in vogue when the stage was repeatedly set for war one generation after another down through the ages.

In our own Washington the investigators are investigating questionable business deals little removed from the life and blood of American youth. It appears they are investigating not so much to condemn the guilty and stamp out the damnable practice as they are to discredit the opposition party.

If there is going to be shooting one against the other, let it be done in the name of common justice and decency and out of respect for those noble youth who sacrificed their lives in war.

Both Guilty

Records recently uncovered in Germany indicate that Russia and Germany carried on commerce one with the other during the first two years of World War II. It is now proposed to “pit the Soviet behavior against the Kremlin's current claims that Russia is infallible in international affairs.”

It is good to review mistakes. But little can be gained by limiting the review to the other fellow's errors. When we direct the accusing finger at Russia we should say, “Russia, while you were playing ball with Hitler we were mighty busy shipping scrap iron and cotton and other things to Japan. We made a grave mistake. We'll overlook yours if you'll overlook ours, and then let's profit by those mistakes.”

But there seems to be no diplomat or career man on the face of the earth who would dare withdraw the accusing finger, sit down and ponder the conglomeration of mistakes nations and individuals made and are continuing to make.
